

Printondemand bags Océ award for digi innovation



Printondemand-worldwide has toasted its investment in a brace of new Océ VarioPrint machines, a 6320 and a 6250, by scooping the Océ UK award for innovation in digital book printing.

The machines have been installed at the firm's Peterborough headquarters, which produces a range of paperback and hardback titles.

The new kit forms part of £600,000 investment by the book printer that also includes an HP Indigo 5000 digital press and an upgrade in its PUR binding operations.

Andy Cork (left), managing director of Printondemand-worldwide, said the company had come a long way in a short time.

"The award from Océ recognises our significant achievements in driving efficiencies and streamlining down to four processes from 16 in just 18 months," he said.
